MSC Napoli is 275 metres long and thirty metres wide, it has 2,394 containers. It left Antwerp in Belgium bound for Portugal with a lot of dangerous produces like oil, petroleum, and kerosene.

On January 18th 2007, Napoli was craked and liberated two hundred containers in the English Channel. It was caused by heavy winds called "windstorm Kyrill" so Napoli was run aground fifty miles off the coast of Lizard. It lost produces. Twenty-six crew members could be saved. Two French anti-pollution tugs "Alcyon and Argonaute" are on the spot to help.

On the French coast, there were motorbikes. Six hundred birds, three dolphins, a satsuna were killed and a thousand birds are dying because of hydrocarbon.

French and British teams are trying to keep the boat in balance and get the oil back.
